Guest Speaker: **PAUL M. LAWTON** --The Sinking of the U.S.S. Eagle PE-56 – Silent Victim of the U-853. Paul is a local attorney that has been actively involved in recreational technical shipwreck diving since 1978. His early diving experiences aroused his curiosity in the thousands of recorded shipwrecks in New England waters, and he spent nearly twenty years studying naval and maritime history, particularly the battle of the Atlantic and German U-boat operations in New England waters. In June 2001, Mr. Lawton succeeded in compelling the U.S. Navy to correct official naval history, crediting the sinking of the PE-56 to "enemy action" by the U-boat 853, resulting in the belated issuance of Purple Heart Medals to the casualties on June 8, 2002.

INFORMAL MEETING INFORMATION and DIRECTIONS

Wednesday, January 7th, 2002, at 6: 30 p.m. at the home of Scott Matey, 103 Gainsborough St, Boston MA 103 Gainsborough Street, Apt. 104, Boston. No allergy alerts! However, there is a parking alert! As I live in the city, street parking is by residential permit only (you may get a ticket - but you will never get towed). There are limited meters in the area and a parking garage around the corner. Directions to my home are as follows:

From West of the City: Mass Pike to the Copley/Pru Exit. Stay left on the off ramp for the Pru exit. Merge onto Huntington Ave. Go through 2 lights and stay left to go under Mass Ave. On the other side of Mass Ave, turn right at first light (Burger King on corner) onto Gainsborough St. Go through the blinking light at first intersection. 103 is halfway up on the right side. NOTE: Meter parking available on first block of Gainsborough (before the blinking light).

From South of the City: 93 North to Mass Ave. exit (#18). Follow signs for Mass Ave off highway exit. Merge (right) onto Mass Ave (Boston Medical Center on right side). Travel north on Mass Ave until you reach Huntington Ave. (Symphony Hall on left side). Stay in left lane and turn left onto St. Stephen Street immediately after you pass Symphony Hall (sharp left - not the soft left towards the Whole Foods market). Go one block and turn right at the blinking light onto Gainsborough. 103 halfway up on right side.

From North of the City: 93 South to Storrow Drive Exit. Storrow Drive West to Fenway exit. Stay left on exit (Fenway, not Kenmore Square). At traffic light, turn left on Riverway. Bear right to stay on Riverway (do not follow signs for Boylston St). Follow Riverway to second light and turn right onto Hemenway St. Take first left onto Symphony Road. At end of street, turn right onto St. Stephan. At blinking light, turn right onto Gainsborough. 103 is halfway up on right side.

IN the City: Take Green Line (E) to Symphony Stop or Orange

Line to Mass Ave. stop.

Parking: You can park on Gainsborough but you risk a ticket. BTDC does not ticket daily. There are limited meter spots (meters are off at 6 so no money is needed) on first block of Gainsborough and some surrounding streets. If you prefer, there is a parking garage a block and half away - at the end of Gainsborough, turn right onto Hemenway, go to traffic light and turn right onto Westland Ave and 3/4 way down the street on left side is a parking garage.

Wednesday, February 4, 2004, at the home of Alan Budreau and Diana Hughes, 206 Holden Wood Road, Concord, MA. Phone: (978) 369-8132 or 8649.

From Rte. 128/195, take Rte. 2 West about 6 miles to the Sudbury Road traffic light and turn left (South). Sudbury Road is not well marked, but is the traffic light past the Walden Pond/Rte. 126 one. The Texaco station on the left is the best landmark - Sudbury Road is just past it. Go about 1/2 mile on Sudbury Road and cross the Sudbury River. Take an immediate left on Heaths Bridge Road. Go to end and turn right on Valley Road. Go to end and turn right on Holden Wood Road. Look for large red house on right, with "206 HUGHES-BUDREAU" on the sign in front. There are two lights above the sign. There will be a dive flag in front, as well as NEADC signs at the intersections. If you use a map please note that we are at West Circle.

If it is easier to come from I495, take Rte. 2 East and look for the Rte. 62 intersection and then Emerson Hospital on the right as landmarks. It is about 10 miles from I495 to Sudbury Road. Sudbury Road is the traffic light past Emerson Hospital. Go right and follow the above instructions

WHAT IS BAY STATE COUNCIL OF DIVERS?

The Bay State Council of Divers, Inc. (commonly known as the BSC) was founded in the early 1970's to represent the organized divers in Massachusetts. The Bay State Council of Divers is a member of the Underwater Society of America which is composed of other dive councils, clubs and independent divers throughout North America. The Bay State Council of Divers, which is managed by a Board of Directors, meets approximately four times a year. The Bay State Council of Divers membership is made up of over 700 individual divers, clubs, dive shop owners, charter boat captains, scuba instructors and other interested persons throughout the state. The Bay State Council of Divers was organized for the following purposes:

- 1 To disseminate information relative to the sport of diving and legislation affecting divers.
2. To create public sentiment for the encouragement of skin and scuba diving;
3. To promote safety, education and conservation in the sport of skin and scuba diving;
4. To cooperate with and assist government officials in the use of diving in connection with governmental functions;
5. To sponsor competitive activities in the sport of diving;
6. To give aid and assistance to groups desiring to organize diving organizations;
7. To educate the public and diving community in the sport of skin and scuba diving;
8. To advance educational and literary endeavors in the field of underwater activities.

The annual Bay State Council of Divers Underwater Treasure Hunt competition is performed in May or June of each year and is their major fundraiser. It is an enjoyable family event providing an opportunity to meet new dive buddies, compete in a friendly environment and win prizes while supporting the Bay State Council of Divers.

As a member of the Underwater Society of America, the Bay State Council of Divers sanctions local, regional and national competitions each year in scuba, free diving, underwater hockey, fin swimming, underwater rugby and underwater photography.

The Bay State Council of Divers promotes recreational diving and helps keep divers informed through the Bay State Council of Divers Newsletter which is sent to all members.

Board of Directors meetings are held approximately four times a year and all Bay State Council of Divers members are invited to attend. **February 11, 2004** is the next meeting.

LOWELL LECTURE SERIES -- OCEAN EXPLORERS

Tuesday, December 9, 2003 • 6 p.m. Simon's IMAX Theatre. **Ancient Shipwrecks in the Black Sea.** Robert Ballard, President of the Institute for Exploration, Mystic, Connecticut, Director of the Institute for Archaeological Oceanography, University of Rhode Island's Graduate School of Oceanography

Renowned underwater explorer Bob Ballard is a veteran of more than 110 deep sea expeditions. Although many of his expeditions have been in search of lost ships and ancient history, Bob Ballard spent 30 years at the Woods Hole Oceanographic Institution where he pioneered the development of deep submergence exploration technology including the submersible ALVIN and the JASON remotely operated vehicle system. There, he participated in the first exploration of the Mid-Ocean Ridge and the discovery of hydrothermal vents and their exotic animal communities. Bob Ballard is best known for his 1985 discovery of the Titanic and has succeeded in tracking down numerous other significant shipwrecks throughout his career including the German battleship Bismarck, the lost fleet of Guadalcanal, the American aircraft carrier Yorktown, sunk in World War II's Battle of Midway and most recently, the final remains of President John F. Kennedy's PT-109. The present focus of his research and the subject of his talk will be his recent expedition to the Black Sea where he has discovered and excavated ancient shipwrecks in the highly-preserving bottom waters of that sea.

Temperatures are always in the mid-80's with a constant breeze. Grand Cayman is a British island, so the language is English. Currency is Cayman dollar, although there is little need to exchange.
