INFORMAL MEETING INFORMATION

Wednesday, April 7, 2004, at 6: 30 p.m. at the home of Janet MacCausland, 26 Lakeview Drive, Raynham, MA, (508) 824-1569. It is a wooden ranch house with a porch.

DIRECTIONS:

From Boston: (about 30 miles):

Take 93/SE Expressway to 128 N/ 95 toward Dedham to Rte. 24 south toward Fall River. That's a left hand exit, so get over soon after merging onto 128.

Now going on 24 south, pass Brockton, and take the Rte. 104 exit (# 15) for Bridgewater and Raynham.

At the end of the ramp, bear right toward Raynham. Go about two miles until you come to a stop sign at a four-way irregular intersection. You will be looking across at a mini-mall with a Tedeschi's, Crown Dry Cleaners, and Post Office. Bear left onto Center Street, which is still Rte. 104.

Take your first right after the mini-mall onto Lakeview Drive. #26 will be the second house on the left.

From Rte 495:

Take the Rte. 138 exit (#8) south toward Taunton.

Go about half a mile and look for a building shaped like a huge milk bottle on the left, and a Texaco. It is a congested area, so slow down and look for, and take, a left hand turn onto Center Street.

Go about a mile and a half to the same four-way intersection above, with the Tedeschi's, Crown Dry Cleaners, and Post Office, but continue straight through. You have the right of way and do not need to stop.

Take the first right after this mini-mall onto Lakeview Drive. #26 will be the second house on the left.

EXCITING NEW DIVE CLUB PROJECT WITH THE NEW ENGLAND AQUARIUM

The New England Aquarium Dive Club, Inc. is undertaking an exciting new initiative for which the Board seeks the support of all members. As you are aware, the New England Aquarium is in the midst of a financial crisis. Many of this year's projects were postponed or cancelled due to lack of funding. Dive Club Board members obtained a list of some of these projects and found several that might be within the resources of the Dive Club to facilitate. Although there were many worthy projects, the project chosen was selected because it is within the financial means of the Club and because it involves the Giant Ocean Tank – to provide two cownose rays (*Rhinoptera bonasus*) for the Giant Ocean Tank.

It has been several years since these beautiful rays have graced the Giant Ocean Tank at the New England Aquarium. The last of the pair of cownose rays died after a long life at the New England Aquarium. During their lives, the pair successfully reproduced and their offspring still populate several other aquaria in the United States. It would be wonderful to have these magnificent and popular members of the shark family back at the Aquarium.

We do need your support and VOTE on this project as it falls outside the regular expenses of operating the dive club and outside the usual level of donation. As mandated by our Constitution and By-Laws, Notice of a Vote to be held at the General Meeting of March 17, 2004 is hereby given to the membership. The vote will be on a motion as follows:

That the New England Aquarium Dive Club, Inc. provide one half of the funding required to provide two cownose rays to the New England Aquarium for the Giant Ocean Tank in an amount up to \$700.00. The second half of the funding is to be provided by the weekly 50/50 drawing and other designated fundraising efforts of the Dive Club under the direction of the Board.

There will be a brief discussion period for members to pose questions and/or present arguments for or against the motion prior to the vote.

MEMBER REPORTS OF LAST YEAR'S DIVES AND THIS YEAR'S GOALS

Jenny Wu: I had an excellent couple of dives up in Eastport, Maine, in July and October 2003. The abundant marine life up there is quite amazing! What made it excellent was the microcosm of marine life in just a few feet of water compared to diving in Cape Ann where you have to swim at least 100 feet or more depending on the tide to see critters. If you were doing a dive off Dog Island in Eastport, the wall is completely covered with 80% of what is in Andy Martinez's book, *Marine Life of the North Atlantic*. It's a spectacular site.

Secondly, my goal for the current year is basically the same every year since I've been diving - to become a better diver, to continue absorbing knowledge, and disseminate what knowledge I have to my diving and non-diving friends.

Barry Holt: My goals for this year are for my gear to become reacquainted with the wide world outside of the hall closet and to lead at least one club dive.

An interesting feature of last year was the August coral-spawning dive in the Texas Flower Garden Banks marine sanctuary. In addition to watching coral do it, it also included diving an oil rig for the first time.

Some other great places that I have been meaning to write about before but never did were trips to Cape Breton (wrecks on every dive, scary big lobsters, and warm(!) water), and Vancouver Island, British Columbia, for the giant octopus, kelp, salmon, mountains, whales, hot springs -- and then there was Tuesday....

Steve Whitford: One very memorable dive I had last year was the Seal Dive run by Donna Romano. I heard about it early on, and had never done anything like it before, so I signed up. On the ride out to the Isle of Shoals, I heard stories about how playful the seals were, but was completely unprepared for the reality. On my first dive I found a nice shallow area where a few were playing, and watched them for a while, then I started to swim away, and the seals followed! I was swimming along and felt a tug on my fin. When I turned around, there was a seal, less than two feet away! This continued for a while, and on the second dive, I found a spot where one seal let us come fairly close, and he just watched us for a while – it was an incredible moment just staring into each other's eyes. Once in a while I swam up from the bottom, and the seal followed, mirroring my movements. Even when we were swimming away, the seal continued to swim along parallel to us. I took my eyes off of it to check my compass and start heading back to the boat, and suddenly I felt another tug – and there were three swimming around my fins!

This year, I plan to do the seal dive again, and I now have my advanced certification, so I'm going to try some of the wrecks, possibly even the Triple Wreck Dive. I've dived some small, shallow wrecks in other places, but I've never gone to one in New England, and I'm looking forward to giving it a try.
