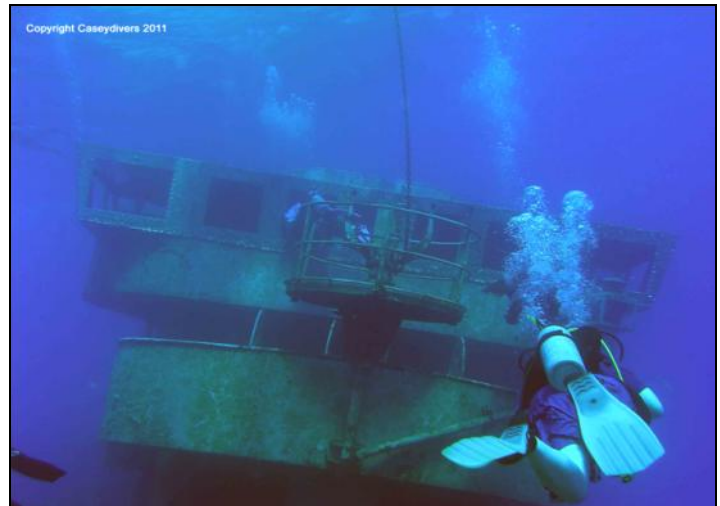
**From your Dive Boat Coordinator,

Are you ready for some boat dives?

After a short absence from the NEADC Board I'm back and ready to run boat dives for 2012!

Captain Jim Sullivan, owner of Boston SCUBA and an NEADC Member, is now running charters year round out of East Boston. We'll schedule some charters this season with him including lobstering, scalloping and possibly some wreck dives around Boston Harbor. NEADC members also save \$10 on each of his trips!

This season we are also planning more of our popular Seal Dives to Isle of Shoals leaving from Rye, NH. If you haven't done this trip, you don't know what you are missing! I will also be running charters to the paddle wheeler "Lady of the Lake." My new 32' boat is on Lake Winnepesaukee out of Gilford, NH and there is parking at the slip. It has a huge swim/dive platform, shower & fridge. About 5 minutes out, the "Lady" is 125 feet long, in about 30 feet of water and a nice wreck to explore. I will also have my scuba compressor aboard this year for fills. **Dive safe & dive often!**

The USS Kittiwake, a former submarine rescue ship of 251 ft, began its life in 1944 at the end of WWII. In February 2010, it began preparation for a new life. In Virginia, the ship went through a tremendous amount of remediation work and in December 2010, she was finally moved to her new home in Grand Cayman and sunk January 5, 2011.

She now lays on the ocean floor creating an artificial reef at recreational diver depths. Much of the wreck, including the bridge, recompression chambers and original fire fighting cannon is easily recognizable by divers. She is now showing signs of life with new marine growth and plenty of hiding places for fish both large and small.

Trip Report: Waiting for Mantas in Hanifaru Bay by Anna Krowczynska

The Maldives, a chain of atolls in the Indian Ocean, is a popular dive site for European divers, but much less known to American divers. One of the reasons is the long flight to Male, usually through Dubai or Qatar. The Maldives is the flattest country in the world, with a highpoint of just 2.4 meters (about 7.2 feet). A third of the Maldives' estimated 300,000 population live on the capital island of Male. The population is Muslim, so alcohol is banned on the islands, but there is plenty of it in the resorts and on live-aboards. The smallest Muslim nation in the world, it has a long-standing multi-party democratic political system. Unlike many other Muslim countries, women also play a prominent role in the Maldivian society, with many civic and businesses leadership positions.



The Maldives is known for some of the most magnificent marine life seen anywhere in the world including whale sharks (an animal at the top of most divers "must-see" list), rays, turtles and sharks. My single reason for going there was to witness the masses of manta rays that congregate to feed in Hanifaru Bay in the Baa Atoll. From May through November, currents and upwellings carry huge amounts of plankton into the bay attracting hundreds of mantas. I was traveling with a group lead by Jonathan Bird, who was planning to shoot an episode about manta rays for his TV series *Jonathan Bird's Blue World*. Our home for 10 days was the Maldives Aggressor, a 115 foot schooner carrying 20 passengers and crew of 10. The sails weren't just for decoration and we used them whenever weather and winds were favorable. As always on an Aggressor live-aboard, the service and food were superb.

Our first trip to Hanifaru Bay ended in disappointment, no mantas! We saw a few mantas at the cleaning stations, but not hundreds of mantas feeding on plankton. So, we sailed to explore other dive sites on Baa and Noonu atolls. There were plenty of different fish from Napoleon wrasse, sweetlips and gray reef sharks to leaf-fish, soapfish and batfish, but only few manta rays.

Finally, a week after boarding the boat we got the signal that mantas were coming to Hanifaru Bay. We quickly sailed there and we weren't disappointed. For a few hours each afternoon the bay was full of mantas. They were gracefully gliding around, never touching each other (or divers) with their mouths wide open gorging on plankton. The view was unforgettable – some people were snorkeling, other using scuba gear and everybody was either filming or shooting stills. I got several hundred shots of mantas, even some good ones!

At the end of the trip we flew over the Male atolls in a seaplane. TransMaldivian Airways operates 23 De Havilland DHC 6 Twin Otter aircrafts and have regular flights from Male to far flung resort atolls. Overall, the Maldives are a magical place, worthy of enduring a very long flight.
