FISH IDENTIFICATION PROGRAM
SATURDAY, JULY 7th at NEW ENGLAND AQUARIUM

There will be a REEF/GAFC (Great American Fish Count) training Saturday July 7 from 10-12. Location is to be determined at the Conference Center of New England Aquarium. REEF will supply underwater fish ID cards, waterproof diver survey paper, and scan forms. REEF's mission, to educate and enlist divers in the conservation of marine habitats, is accomplished primarily through the REEF fish survey project. Developed in 1990, the project allows divers and snorkelers to collect and report information on marine fish populations. The Northeast/Gulf of Maine survey was recently added to REEF's database. I encourage you all to attend and help build up the database, which is used by resource agencies and researchers.

As an added bonus, the Great American Fish Count, held every July, is including the "GAFC Challenge". Volunteers attending GAFC-sanctioned dives are eligible for regional prizes as well as an overall vacation for two.

So, come out to learn what that funky fish you always see is, show your support for REEF and conservation, and participate in the GAFC dives Jim Stewart is organizing in July. And just maybe you'll win some great prizes!

New England Artificial Reef Society

The New England Artificial Reef Society (NEARS) is a newly formed non-profit organization dedicated to the creation of artificial reefs in the coastal waters of New England. Its mission statement reads:

"Create artificial reefs and provide education about these reefs in an effort to improve marine habitat in coastal waters of New England and ensure the continuance of a healthy and abundant ocean for present and future generations."

For many years, divers and fishermen have known that shipwrecks are often teeming with life. While shipwrecks have long been the best known form of artificial reefs, any structure placed in the water to provide additional benthic relief and habitat for marine life qualifies as an artificial reef. Many states around the country have an active artificial reef program. In NJ and FL, their main goals were to develop recreational opportunities for fishermen and divers. In CA, the San Diego Oceans Foundation has pursued artificial reef development with the purpose of increasing benthic relief and improving the marine habitat. Their most recent artificial reef, the HMCS Yukon, was sunk in July and already has kelp growing on the ship's hull.

In Massachusetts, there has been relatively little activity around artificial reefs. While Massachusetts has defined guidelines and permitting procedures, only 3 projects have been implemented thus far, and without funding, there was little hope for the future expansion of the program. NEARS was created to develop that funding and provide a broad based constituency dedicated to the marine environment. Our mission is to create artificial reefs and provide education about these reefs in an effort to improve the marine habitat in coastal waters of New England and ensure the continuance of a healthy and abundant ocean for present and future generations.

In the short term, we will work to assist the Division of Marine Fisheries with the local dive clubs in determining the suitability of 4 previously identified locations that maybe suitable for small artificial reefs. In the long term, we will work with the Division of Marine Fisheries to identify new sites for artificial reefs and to develop the funding necessary for implementing artificial reef projects on a wide scale. We believe only a broad based organization can bring together the various interest groups such as divers, recreational fishermen, environmental groups and many others who care about the ocean. We have already received the support of the Division of Marine Fisheries, New England Aquarium and local diving and fishing interests. We hope to enlist your support as well.

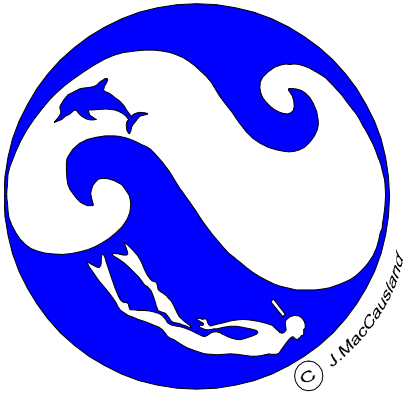

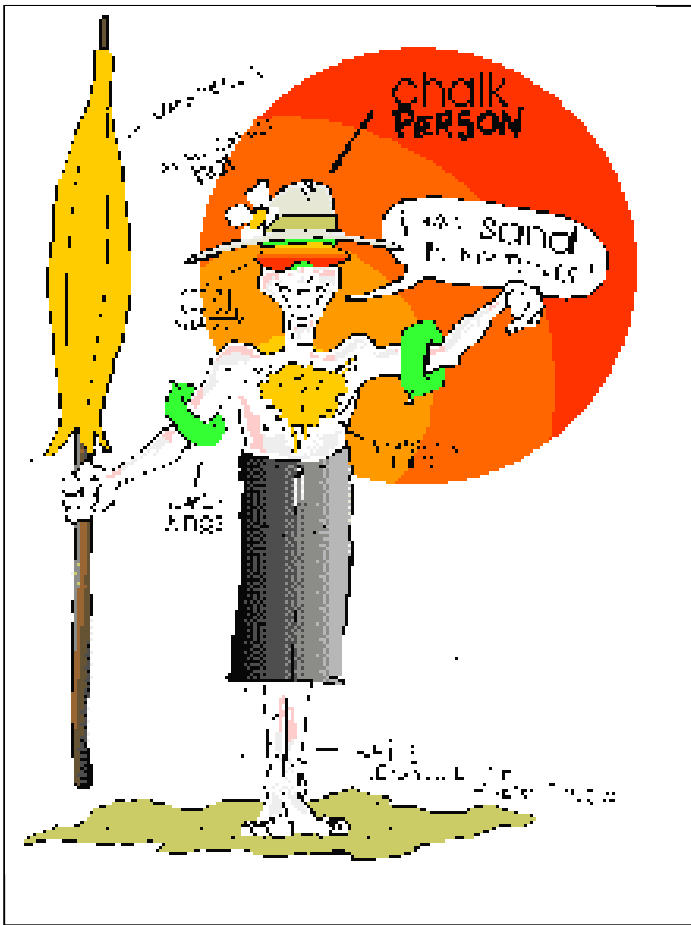
STELLWAGEN BANK NATIONAL MARINE SANCTUARY ADVISORY COUNCIL

The Stellwagen Bank National Marine Sanctuary is seeking applicants for its Sanctuary Advisory Council. The Sanctuary is seeking people with a dedication and commitment to a healthy ecosystem on and around Stellwagen Bank and to the communities whose economies rely on this ecosystem. The Council is being formed to provide the Superintendent with advice on management of the Sanctuary. Council members also will serve as liaisons to the community on Sanctuary issues and act as a conduit relaying community interests and concerns to the Superintendent.

Applicants are chosen based upon their particular expertise and experience in relation to the seat for which they are applying; community and professional affiliations; and philosophy regarding the conservation and management of marine resources. A total of 21 individuals will make up the Council. Fifteen of these seats are reserved for public participants representing research, education and conservation groups, commercial interests, and three at-large seats. Six of the seats are reserved for government agency representatives serving as ex-officio members of the Council.

Application packages are available by contacting the Sanctuary office. The application deadline is June 8, 2001. Selection and confirmation of Council membership should be completed by July 16, 2001. Individuals selected will help provide technical and strategic advice to the Sanctuary Superintendent. It is anticipated that the Council will meet approximately four times per year; however, between July and October 2001 meetings may be more frequent. Participation on the Council is on a completely voluntary basis.

SOME OF THE WRECKS:

The U-352

A German Submarine (VII-C Class) 218 feet long was sunk April 9, 1942 by the United States Coast Guard Cutter "ICARUS". This vessel is possibly the most intact and unique wreck in this area. This is the signature dive in the Morehead City area. The maximum depth of the dive is 110 feet.

The PAPOOSE

An American Tanker 412 ft. in length was torpedoed & sunk on March 3, 1942 by the German Submarine U-124 Vessel is intact & upside down with the hull rising approx. 30 ft. off the bottom. This wreck is a breeding ground for Atlantic Sand Tiger Sharks. Depth of dive is approx. 125 ft.

The SHURTZ

A WW1 German Cruiser 225 ft. in length was captured & repatriated by the U.S. at the outbreak of the war. On June 21, 1918 it sunk after colliding with the S.S. FLORIDA. Time has taken a heavy toll on this vessel. The deck cannons, boilers & engines are the remaining structures visible making this an excellent dive. Many artifacts are still being recovered. This is one of the prettiest dives South of Cape Lookout! Depth of dive is approx. 110 ft.

THE ULTIMATE UNDERWATER VIDEO COURSE WITH JONATHAN BIRD

Get ahead of the competition and learn all the basics of shooting and editing underwater video in just one week!

About the Course...November 3-10, 2001, Jonathan Bird is teaching an in-depth course in video production focusing on the specific art of creating underwater video. The one week course on Bonaire will cover concepts in storyboarding, planning, gear consideration, composition, lighting, shooting for the edit, editing and advanced underwater techniques in macro and wide-angle video. This is not just a week of fun diving on Bonaire, but a complete course in video for anyone interested in learning how to shoot like a professional. Want to be a really good underwater shooter? Take a few years off your learning curve and take a class from a guy who shoots underwater for a living.

The course will feature 3 hours per day of classroom instruction with daily shooting and editing assignments to be reviewed by the class each evening. The schedule will be busy...because there is a lot of material to squeeze into a week. At the end of the week, there will be a "film fest" where all the students will show off a 3-5 minute video. Both people do not need to take the course. You are welcome to bring a dive buddy or spouse who is not taking the course. We will book their room and they will only pay the standard rate for the room/diving/food, not for the course (\$868.00). If you want to travel alone, we can either get the rate for a single or possibly pair you up with someone else who is alone. Let us know in advance, because that is tricky. We have booked a block of 11 double rooms for this trip and any deviation from that needs to be done well in advance.

To confirm a spot on this trip, we need a \$500 deposit per student. The deposit is sufficient to hold the entire room, so if two people are coming on the trip but only one is taking the course, we still only need \$500. Once you are booked, you need to reserve your own flight to Bonaire. If you need assistance, drop us a line. An additional \$1000.00 is due on August 1, 2001 and the remainder (\$1,300.00) is due by October 1, 2001. If you are a non-student joining the trip, your payment is due in full by August 1, 2001. (This is because we have to pay Habitat in full at that time.)
